1	Welcome	
	JU welcomed new members to the first meeting of the Advisory Board under the new HWR contract 2025-27.	
2	Declarations of Interest	
	None were declared.	
3	HWR Annual priorities and work plan 2025-26	
	The plan, which had been previously reviewed offline, was approved.	
5	Updates	
	Integrated Care Board (ICB) – JU	
	NHSE's Model ICB Blueprint was published in May 2025 and requires ICBs to reduce running costs to £18.76 per head of population by the end of Q3 this financial year (December). For LLR, already a 'lean' ICB, this means a 33% cut from £31.7m to £21.1m. ICB's are expected to come together into bigger areas or "clusters" to take advantage of economies of scale. Plans must be submitted by 30/5/25.	
	Current proposal is that LLR will cluster with Northamptonshire, with Toby Sanders as the joint CEO. The clusters' new role will be focused on commissioning and other services will be moved out into local authorities and neighbourhoods, subject to legislation changes.	
	The biggest financial risks for LLR are thought to be workforce reductions and prescribing. There is little detail known outside of the public announcements at this time.	
	Consultation on access to same-day healthcare in Rutland: update	
	The results of the consultation (run from January-March this year) had been published. The response rate was high, with good representation from communities.

	In summary, people supported the combining of minor illness and minor injury services into a single clinic but want longer opening hours for the clinic and Xray and also a walk-in option for access.

	 Recruitment for a Healthwatch Engagement Officer was underway with the vacancy closing that day. Candidates would be offered full disclosure on what is known about the potential closure of Healthwatch leaked to the press the previous weekend. Outreach and Enter and View activities would continue to be largely paused until the new officer is in place. Website to be updated with board members details – all asked to send a short biography and photo to TA-J.
